RE: NEW SORT OF MILK PLASTIC CUPS (PLASTIC #5)

Since October 2006, Encorp has been participating in the collection and recycling of milk containers on behalf of the B.C. Dairy Council (BCDC). Collection of milk containers (*excluding yogurt or cottage cheese containers*) for recycling is a voluntary return program, and is not part of the return for deposit system.



In May 2008, The BC Dairy Council added Milk Plastic Cups made from Plastic # 5 with foil lids (120 ml) to the voluntary program and therefore, a new sort will be introduced:

Code	Commodity	Container Size	Bag count	Co-mingle	Handling Fee
7720	Plastic Milk Cups	120 ml	150 units/bag	Plastic # 5 only	\$2.25/bag

It is anticipated that the Milk Plastic Cups (120 ml) will be returned to depot locations mainly from Schools and Institutions, mostly Hospitals in the Lower Mainland. The Schools and Institutions have been informed to separate them from the other plastics. For your reference, please refer to the sample picture above of a dairy plastic cup that falls into this category.

Procedure

1. Since the number of Milk Cups (SKU 7720) that are allowed to be put in one bag is set at a maximum of 150, the bag will appear to be half-full. Therefore, the transporters will be instructed to pick up half-full bags that contain **only** Milk Cups. Other bags that contain other Plastics and Polycoat milk containers are to be filled to capacity. No other half bags will be accepted for pick up by the transporter.
2. All milk containers have to be entered into the POR system once the bag is ready for shipping and the POR manifest is printed when the bags are being shipped out.
